The map shows a few places linked to our industrial and religious history. After the trail, can you close your eyes and remember the B's? The Five B's: Brushes Baptists Beer Boots Did you know? Key Lowndes The first recorded reference Trail to Chesham is under the old English name Cæstæleshamm, Be careful when crossing the roads! meaning 'the river-meadow at the pile of stones."

Did you know?

The River Chess is a chalk stream.



Did you know?

The first mention of Chesham is in 970AD in the will of Lady Elgiva (wife of the Saxon King Edwy).

14 High Street

The oldest parts of this building date from the 1400s!

It was a coaching inn from 1622.

The stagecoach journey from here to London took five hours.

How many windows does the front of the building have?



Roger Crabbe set up a hat shop here in the mid 1600s. The Mad Hatter character in *Alice in* Wonderland may be based on him.

The clock tower in Market Square stands where a large Market Hall was. The tower was rebuilt in 1992 and the bell added in 2014.

35 Germain Street

This was Chesham's poor house before 1835, also known as the workhouse. You would have lived here if you were very poor and had nowhere else to go.

5 Church Street

54-56 Church Street is the oldest house in Chesham and dates back to the 1300s. Which floor of the house is the oldest part?

6 St Mary's Church

St Mary's Church was built in the 12th century on top of puddingstones. Can you see any?

Can you find the Thomas Harding Memorial? He was caught with an English bible. This was illegal, so he was arrested and killed.

7 Lowndes Park

William Lowndes was secretary to the treasury for Queen Anne and he lived at The Bury in the early 1700s.

He had a big family. Try and guess how many children he had.

Decorate William's wig.



The Gate House

The Gate House was built in the 1600s.

The timber frame was rediscovered recently, hidden behind a shopfront.

Walk underneath it to the courtyard and find two bricks inscribed with dates by the windows on your right-hand side.
